



## Scope and aims

#### SCOPE OF THE WORKSHOP

The three organisations EA, EUROLAB and EU-RACHEM are key players in the conformity assessment scene in Europe. This workshop "Accreditation – a tool to develop competence?" was initiated by their so-called Permanent Liaison Group (PLG). This group is a platform for the exchange of views, analysis of potential problems and search for solutions.

#### ACCREDITATION

- is the formal attestation by an accreditation body, that a conformity assessment body is competent.
- It has been fostered by the European Commission and the member states as a tool for facilitating the free movement of goods within the European Economic Area.
- After 20 years of experience it is now time to review the concept and procedures of accreditation.
- The aim of such a review is to avoid a purely bureaucratic approach of accreditation.

#### WORKSHOP AIMS

- Exploring the potentials of suitable accreditation assessments and quality management procedures
- Stimulating continuous improvement and a learning process within the conformity assessment bodies.
- Trying to identify the prerequisites for such a development: there will be two sessions on the competence of staff and on accreditation as a learning process.
- Both accreditation experts and laboratory practitioners will jointly search for solutions - as a win-win situation for both sides.
- The workshop is very timely, because of the ongoing revision of the New and Global Approaches by the European Union: first-hand information on the potential impact on accreditation systems in Europe and on the community of notified bodies will be provided in the first session and the panel discussion in the afternoon.

#### **GERMAN QUESTIONS**

The lecture on the developments of the rather unique accreditation system will especially be of interest for the German participants. There will be an additional discussion group in German language addressing the specific German situation.

#### PERSONALIA

Within the frame of the workshop the accreditation community will say goodbye to Hans-Ulrich Mittmann who will retire in October 2007. Hans-Ulrich Mittmann has been chairman of the German Accreditation Council (DAR) from the beginning. As German delegate to EA and ILAC for many years he has greatly contributed to the development of accreditation and peer evaluation in the world.
